Reflection

While writing my poem, I get my inspiration from Virginia Woolf and her Angel that she had to kill. Woolf in her essay, Professions for Women, criticizes Coventry Patmore and his understanding of an ideal woman. As Woolf stated in her essay, female writers come across many obstacles while writing, obtaining a pen and a paper is not the only obstacle anymore. Based on this problem, I tried to reflect the typical day of a woman figure, who wants to produce but cannot focus on her writing. Since housework is seen as an innate duty of a woman, it is not possible for a woman to obtain a room of her own and started to write. The Angel figure in the poem symbolizes the responsibilities of the woman, constantly get in her way, and remind her that writing is not her responsibility but cooking and taking care of her baby is.
