General Information about the Programme

The Department of English Language and Literature of the Faculty of Foreign Languages offers a 4-year undergraduate programme. The medium of instruction is English, excluding compulsory and elective courses students must take from other departments.

All qualifying students are required to take an English Proficiency Test or demonstrate competence in English. Those who are successful by taking 80 out of 100 at the proficiency test begin their studies in the Department. Students who fail the proficiency test are required to complete the English Preparatory Programme of the School of Foreign Languages at Social Sciences University of Ankara.

The main objective of the Undergraduate Programme of the Department of English Language and Literature is to teach English literature and culture, train researchers, and promote research in this field.

Provisions for Registration

Students are required to hold a valid high school diploma issued by the Republic of Turkey Ministry of National Education, or other international diplomas authorised by the Ministry of National Education to register for the Undergraduate Programme. Students should succeed in the Language Test (DİL) of the Higher Education Institutions Examination (YKS) by the National Assessment Selection and Placement Center.

Entry requirements for the international students: International Students should comply with the requirements of the Regulations of Admission for the International Students of the Turkish Higher Educational Council, and the Criteria for Admitting International Students announced by Social Sciences University of Ankara per academic year.

Qualification Requirements and Regulations

The students who successfully complete their studies receive an undergraduate diploma and the title of English philologist. It is required to satisfy the necessary conditions indicated in Social Sciences University of Ankara Undergraduate Degree Academic Education and Exam Regulations, article 26; complete at least 165 ECTS of the departmental compulsory courses including the common compulsory courses (145 ECTS of departmental compulsory courses – 20 ECTS of common compulsory courses); complete 75 ECTS of elective courses, including at least 35 ECTS of departmental elective courses and 20 ECTS of one second foreign language courses. It is also required to complete a total of 240 ECTS of the courses and achieve at least 2.00 grade point average out of 4.00.

Specific Arrangements for Recognition of Prior Learning

Individuals qualified to register as undergraduate students in the Department of English Language and Literature are required to have completed successfully their high school education or its equivalent, and they should succeed in the Language Test (DİL) of the Higher Education Institutions Examination (YKS) by the National Assessment Selection and Placement Center.

Requirements for Horizontal Transfers and Inter-Institutional Credit Transfers

For horizontal transfers to the undergraduate programme and for inter-institutional credit transfers, the regulations of Council of Higher Education of Turkey, Social Sciences University of Ankara Undergraduate Degree Academic Education and Exam Regulations, and the criteria specified by the Senate of Social Sciences University of Ankara apply. Requirements for the Erasmus+ Academic Exchange Programmes

After student's stay at the host university for Erasmus+ Student Mobility Programmes is completed, s/he returns to the Department with a transcript indicating the courses and the grades received. These courses and grades are transferred to the grading system of Social Sciences University of Ankara, considering the course equivalence table offered by the International Office. Upon approval by the Head of the Department, the course equivalence table is submitted to the Dean's Office. Following the approval by the Faculty Board, the documents are submitted to the Registrar's Office to be recorded. Procedures related to the student's return are thus completed.

Requirements for the Farabi Exchange Programme

Students applying for the bachelor's degree programme offered by the Department of English Language and Literature, Social Sciences University of Ankara, for a period of one to two semesters within the framework of the Farabi Exchange Programme are expected to be enrolled in a Department of English Language and Literature at the institutions of higher education that signed a protocol with Social Sciences University of Ankara regarding the Farabi Exchange Programme and to have a grade point average no less than 3.0 out of 4.0.

Students enrolled in the Department of English Language and Literature, Social Sciences University of Ankara, applying for the bachelor's degree programme offered by a Department of English Language and Literature at the institutions of higher education that signed a protocol with Social Sciences University of Ankara regarding the Farabi Exchange Programme are expected to have a grade point average no less than 3.0 out of 4.0. It should furthermore be noted that whether the courses students plan to attend at the other institution/s of higher education can be in terms of credit and content accepted as equivalent to those offered by Social Sciences University of Ankara is especially evaluated in the consideration of applications.

Goals and Objectives

The aim of the Department is to enable students to study and acquire the knowledge, competence and skills to conduct interdisciplinary research on English literature and culture, and to apply and share the results of their studies in national and international academic and social platforms.

Occupational Profiles of Graduates with Examples

The graduates of English Language and Literature with teaching certificates may become English teachers or lecturers in many state and private schools and universities. Graduates are also able to find jobs which require cultural and literary knowledge, such as those in tourism, ministries, banks, state and private media institutions. They can also work as translators, writers and/or editors. In addition to the positions in secondary schools and academic institutions, they may work at various state and private companies, and international offices and the European Union departments of the ministries.

Access to Further Studies

Upon successfully completing the requirements with regard to the criteria of the Qualifications Frameworks in the European Higher Education Area, students have the right to continue further graduate studies.

Profile of the Programme

Department of English Language and Literature Undergraduate Programme consists of 8 semesters. Each semester is designed to have a 30-ECTS course load, which makes a total of 240 ECTS for the entire programme. In addition to the courses on subjects of English Language and Literature, there are also courses on Linguistics, Translation and Interpretation, Comparative Literature, Environmental Humanities, Women/Gender Studies and World History. 31 % of the programme consists of elective courses. In order to graduate, students shall get at least 35 ECTS of departmental elective courses and at least 20 ECTS of one second foreign language courses. Other elective courses can be chosen from the elective courses pool of the university and other faculties.

Moreover, as another graduation requirement, the students must pass the common compulsory courses of the university that are indicated in the programme (courses with the codes TURK, AITT, HIST and SEÇ).

All undergraduate courses are one-semester courses, and they are offered only in particular semesters. In principle, the courses with uneven number codes are offered in autumn semester, while those with even number codes are offered in spring semester. There are no courses with pre-requisites in the undergraduate programme; however, it is highly recommended that the students enrol for the successive courses in their order.

The departmental undergraduate courses are theoretical; however, through in-class activities and home assignments, the application of the knowledge acquired in the courses is intensively supported. In general, the first and the second year compulsory courses are designed in order to enable the student to acquire the very basic knowledge and skills in relation to the field of study, while the third and the fourth year courses are designed to study the genres, periods, the representative authors and works of English literature in the light of the acquired knowledge and skills. The departmental elective courses, on the other hand, are designed to address the needs of those students who incline to other fields, such as “Linguistics,”

“Translation and Interpretation,” “Comparative Literature,” “American Culture and Literature,” “Environmental Humanities,” and “Women/Gender Studies.”

Examination Regulations, Assessment and Grading

Assessment and evaluation methods applied in each course are defined in the “Assessment Methods” sections of the course information packets. The relevant articles of Social Sciences University of Ankara Undergraduate Degree Academic Education and Exam Regulations apply to the exams and academic scores of students.

Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate from Social Sciences University of Ankara English Language and Literature Undergraduate Programme, students are required to comply with the Social Sciences University of Ankara Undergraduate Degree Academic Education and Exam Regulations, article 26; complete at least 165 ECTS of the departmental compulsory courses including the common compulsory courses (145 ECTS of departmental compulsory courses – 20 ECTS of common compulsory courses); complete 75 ECTS of elective courses, including at least 35 ECTS of departmental elective courses and 20 ECTS of one second foreign language courses; accomplish the courses corresponding to 240 ECTS, and obtain at least 2.00 grade point average out of 4.00.
